First, LeaderShape[®] is a week-long training designed to immerse you into leadership development in a way that will transform your world! The CATALYST program is similar, but just one full day. Catalyst[®] focuses on learning to develop your own authentic path, connect to groups and causes you care about, and commit to a plan to be a catalyst for yourself and the groups in which you're involved. We know that many graduate students are looking for employment across campus in the form of part-time work or assistantships. The first place to ask is always your department and the program director for your degree or certificate program.

You can also review the jobs that are posted on the [Office of Student Employment page](#). Click Students in the top left corner and you will get to the place where you can search for jobs which is the main ECU employment website: <https://ecu.peopleadmin.com/applicants/jsp/shared/frameset/Frameset.jsp?time=1297801919621>. There, you can click on Student Positions to see a variety of jobs including assistantships and self-help positions. Jobs that are listed as Federal Work/Study are for students who have been awarded federal work/study financial aid. You must speak with the Financial Aid Office to find out more about federal work study options for graduate students.

In addition, the Graduate School emails announcements about assistantships to the Graduate Student listserv when available. Review your emails carefully to watch for assistantship opportunities!

Research & Creative Achievement Week

March 26—April 2, 2018

Research and Creative Achievement Week (RCAW) is an important milestone in the career of many graduate students at East Carolina University. It is important that you speak with your program advisors NOW to determine if you should be submitting something for the 2018 RCAW.

This link <http://blog.ecu.edu/sites/rcaw/online-abstract-submission/> will get you straight to the place to submit an abstract. The abstract submission portal will be open Jan 8, 2018—Feb 2, 2018 and late submissions will not be accepted. Please communicate with your faculty now to determine what you will submit on January 8!

Also, click around the RCAW blog and see all that is there. We will also have training sessions to help students with their oral presentation skills for podium presentations and poster presentations. We hope that you consider a podium presentation instead of a poster, too—the experience is helpful to your development as a graduate student! You can find all the presentation dates, times, and locations already posted on the RCAW [Workshops website](#)! Put them in your calendar now so that you don't miss out on the opportunity to improve your public speaking skills prior to the event!

In addition, the ECU Libraries has a Presentations Help Guide that can give you more information on poster design and content including templates and examples. There is also help in improving your oral presentations, printing a poster and an archive of recordings of past RCAW training sessions! The more you know about RCAW, the better you can prepare and do well!
