# THREE MINUTE THESIS RESULTS



The Three Minute Thesis (3MT) is a research communication competition that challenges master's and doctoral students to present a compelling oration on their research endeavors in just three minutes to a non-specialist audience. The first 3MT was held at the University of Queensland in 2008; enthusiasm for the 3MT concept has grown and its widespread implementation by universities has led to the development of an international competition. Today, the 3MT competition has grown to over 600 universities across more than 65 countries worldwide. East Carolina University (ECU) hosted its sixth annual 3MT event this year, with 15 students competing, representing a wide variety of programs.

Each presentation was judged on comprehension, content, engagement, and communication. Presentations were limited to three-minute maximum (exceeding three minutes leads to disqualification). Although a presenter is allowed to have a single static PowerPoint slide, no additional electronic media are permitted. All presentations were required to be spoken word - for example, no poems or songs - before a panel of three judges, other students, and faculty mentors. This year, we had two heats and the top three presenters from each heat presented for a final round – we actually had seven finalists due to a tie in one heat. The winners of the competition are listed below, but we first want to express our thanks to our competitors, mentors, judges, and Graduate School staff for their preparation and participation and offer our congratulations to the winners

UNDERGRADUATE and GRADUATE students, and POSTDOCTORAL scholars (you must be a current East Carolina University student or postdoctoral scholar to submit an abstract) are invited to present their research to fellow students, colleagues, faculty, and the local community in a professional, conference-style setting.

\*Abstract submissions will close on February 15, 2023. Be aware that this deadline includes official mentor-approvals/final submission.

There will be no departure from the posted schedule, except as noted below: All examinations for one credit hourclasses will be held during the last regular meeting of the class. Classes meeting more than three times a week will follow the examination schedule for MWF classes. Clinical and non-traditional class schedules, including graduate level courses, may also adopt a modified examination schedule as required. A final course meeting during the exam period is required in order to satisfy the 750 contact minutes per credit hour required by the University of North Carolina Office of the President. Department Chairs are responsible for monitoring adherence to scheduled examination requirements. Classes beginning 6:00 pm or later are considered night classes. Examinations in classes meeting one night a week will be held at 7:30-10:00 pm on the first night of their usual meeting during the examination period (December 7 - 14). Examinations in classes meeting two or more nights a week and beginning before 8:00 pm will be held at 7:30-10:00 pm on the first night of their usual meeting during the examination period (December 7 - 14).

Examinations in classes meeting two or more nights a week and beginning at or after 8:00 pm will be held at 7:30-10:00 pm on the second night of their usual meeting during the examination period (December 7 - 14). Distance education classes should give their final examinations in a timely fashion to allow submitting grades in time. Classes beginning on the half hour or meeting longer than one hour will have their final examination at the time determined by the hour during which the classes begin (e.g., 9:30-11:00 am TTh classes will follow the examination schedule of the 8:00 am MWF classes).
