### Graduating in Spring or Summer 2020?

The application for graduate graduation should be completed at least one semester prior to completion of the requirements of the degree or certificate. Application for graduation must be completed online through PiratePort in Banner Self Service. If there are curriculum changes after the student has applied to graduate or if the semester of graduation changes, it is the student's responsibility to notify the Office of the Registrar at regis@ecu.edu to have the graduation application updated. Students who complete the degree requirements after the last day of final exams in the intended term of graduation will be certified for graduation in a subsequent term. You must apply for a degree graduation and a certificate graduation separately, even if they are graduated the same semester



### HELPFUL FINANCIAL INFO

### What Is Financial Aid Payback?

There are times when a graduate student determines finishing classes is not possible during a semester. There may be personal life situations such as illness or employment that pull students away from their work and they are unable to provide their full attention to their studies. There are two ways to remove courses from a schedule - **dropping** (within the first 5 days of Fall/Spring or the first 2 days of summer sessions; nothing on the transcript) or **withdrawing** (W is on the transcript; if after deadline, and F or W is on transcript).

However, in both situations, the student may be in a "Financial Aid Payback" situation. This means, when the drop or withdrawal occurs, federal regulations require the Office of Financial Aid to review the student's record to re-evaluate eligibility for financial aid. If the student is no longer eligible for the amount of aid received or no longer eligible for any financial aid, the student is required to pay back the financial aid to ECU immediately. This includes student loans and refunds the student may have received electronically.

All graduate students who are considering dropping a course (and not replacing it with another) or withdrawing from courses at some point in the semester must consult with the Office of Financial Aid first to determine the financial consequences. Once these are fully understood and arrangements are made, the student then should drop the course or send an email to the Registrar to withdraw from the course.

Students who are considering dropping courses or withdrawing from courses should consult with their advisor or graduate program director as well as the <u>Office of Financial Aid</u> before proceeding. Students are also welcome to email the Graduate School (<u>gradschool@ecu.edu</u>) with questions.

#### ECUAward Scholarship Portal

The Office of University Scholarships oversees many scholarships which are available to students at ECU, both undergraduates & graduate students. Scholarships are gifts of money that do not require repayment. Often based on merit, financial need, or leadership activities for example, there are numerous opportunities in the portal. Students can apply for these scholarships by completing the online application form as well as the FAFSA. The portal will "match" students to scholarships and will also display scholarships that may be of interest that are not automatic match opportunities. Students are encouraged to complete the application each January for the following Fall/Spring terms.
