IMPORTANT GRADUATION CEREMONY DETAILS

We want to recognize and celebrate your achievements at ECU's commencement ceremony and at college or department recognition ceremonies!

There ceremonies provide opportunity for fellow students, faculty, staff, family, friends, etc. to honor and applaud your accomplishments, but there are some important details to which you must attend even as you complete your program of study. Make note of deadlines, dates and times of ceremonies, locations, etc. in the following text so that you and your support team do not miss anything.



The university ceremony for Spring 2023 Commencement will be in person at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium on Friday, May 5 at 10 a.m. All ECU spring 2023 graduates and eligible summer 2023 graduates, including those earning undergraduate, masters, doctoral and professional degrees, will be required to complete an RSVP form to participate in the university commencement ceremony. The RSVP form, which has a deadline of April 14, will be emailed to graduates and posted on the ECU Commencement website. The required RSVP process will assist with logistical planning, guest seating and safety protocols. Students who have completed the RSVP by April 14 will receive additional emailed instructions.

ECU will host college-specific recognition ceremonies on campus May 5-6. Unlike the university commencement ceremony in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, each college recognition ceremony will require tickets for entry. Details for the college recognition are available on the ECU Commencement website. Information about the RSVP, tickets for the college ceremonies and other logistical details will be emailed to those who have applied to graduate throughout March and April.

GRADUATION CHECKLIST

FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS





ACADEMIC TASKS

- Apply to Graduate (Office of the Registrar).
- Review <u>Degree Works</u> with an advisor to ensure all degree requirements are met.
- Upload a thesis or dissertation by the published deadline, if applicable.
- Review your program's requirements and submit documentation of capstone project, internship report, or other major projects, if applicable.
- Review your degree program's policy and arrange to take a comprehensive exam, if applicable.

FINANCIAL TASKS

- Pay all campus balances due including library fines, parking tickets, student account (with <u>Cashier</u>'s Office), student health center, etc.
- Return all borrowed equipment from your department, research lab, and student recreation centers.
- Complete Student Exit Loan Counseling if loans were received; see the email from <u>Financial Aid</u> or talk with your financial aid counselor.

GRADUATION TASKS

- Review https://commencement.ecu.edu to find deadlines for important graduation tasks:
 - Order your cap & gown and purchase hood, <u>noting pick up dates/times</u>. Doctoral students rent commencement regalia by contacting the <u>Dowdy Student Store</u>.
 - RSVP to attend the main graduation ceremony by published deadline.
 - RSVP to attend your department or college recognition ceremony by published deadline.
- Complete Graduate Student Exit Survey (GSES). This will arrive in your ECU email.
- Update your personal email address and add your cell phone number in PiratePort under "My Information" so the University can stay in touch with you.
- Respond to Graduate School emails about walking in the hooding ceremony if you are an EdD, PhD or DrPh graduate. Look for emails from Tania Alvarez (alvarezt@ecu.edu).
- **PhD students only:** Complete the Survey of Earned Doctorates (SED). Instructions emailed from Dean of Graduate School.

RESEARCH TASKS

- Consult with the Institutional Review Board to learn how to "close out" the studies in **ePIRATE** If you are the primary investigator on research studies.
- Discuss with your research mentor and/or the Institutional Review Board how to store data collected as a part of your research assistantship, thesis, or dissertation.
- Ensure you have followed any necessary exit procedures from your research lab & employment.

PERSONAL TASKS

- If you are planning to leave Greenville, review your lease to determine when to give your landlord notice that you will be moving out.
- Make an appointment with <u>Career Services</u> to polish your resume & get advice about job search.



DEADLINE FOR FULL-TERM COURSE WITHDRAWAL IS 23 MARCH

Thursday, 23 March is the 60% mark of the full-term fall semester. As such, 5:00 pm on that date it is the last time to withdraw from a full-term class or for the semester, without grades. It is our hope that very few students will need to withdraw, but life issues and other circumstances occur, and that is why this safety net exists. In fact, we interact with students at the end of every semester who should have withdrawn from classes but did not. Staying in a class or classes when there is no realistic chance for success can lead to probation or program dismissal. However, the Graduate School advises you to use course and term withdrawal wisely as you work to attain your educational goals. Following are some bits of wisdom from graduate students, faculty, graduate advisors, and program directors. Follow this advice before making any decisions:

- Check with your course instructor(s). They will be able to provide feedback about your potential to succeed in class.
- Do not assume you can take an incomplete for a course in which you are behind. Speak with your instructor if you believe circumstances might warrant an incomplete.
- Discuss options with your advisor. For example, if you are taking four courses and the overall load is too heavy, from which course could you withdraw to have the least impact on your plan of study?
- Communicate with your Financial Aid advisor about consequences of withdrawal. In some cases, you may learn that a course withdrawal has minimal consequences, but in other cases the ramifications may be much greater.
- A course withdrawal may or may not impact a graduate assistantship. Consult with your program director to be sure.

Finally, if you are having issues of any type in a class, communicate early and often with the appropriate individuals (instructor, advisor, program director, etc.). Some situations can be resolved early that may be unresolvable later.

Attention Graduating PhD, EdD, and DrPh Students

The University Commencement Committee has a new editing procedure for the graduation program which will be more rigorous. PhD, EdD, and DrPh students who plan to have their name in the program must respond to the email from Tania Alvarez no later than March 13th. That is the final date they can make changes to their program entry including hometown, dissertation title, dissertation mentor, etc.

The abstract submission system is now open!


DEI Connect Conference



All attendees, whether presenters or not, must <u>register to attend.</u> Please submit your registration by no later than Monday, March 6.














4th ANNUAL "CAPTURING THE ART OF SCIENCE" IMAGE COMPETITION HOSTED BY LASER TAG*




About ETS

Robert (Bob) Moses Scholarship

This annually awarded national scholarship is designed to support the educational goals of a graduate student from an underrepresented group who is pursuing a master's or doctoral degree in mathematics education or a STEM discipline. The individual should also have a commitment to civic engagement.

The inaugural scholarship is named in honor of the late Bob Moses, a pioneering civil rights leader and educator who founded The Algebra Project, a national U.S. mathematics literacy program aimed at helping low-income students and students of color achieve the mathematical skills in high school that are a prerequisite for success in college and beyond.



Scholarship Award: \$15,000

Who Is Eligible to Apply?

Any student who:

- is enrolled as a master's or doctoral student in good standing at a public or private U.S. university during the 2022–2023 academic school year
- · demonstrates leadership abilities and commitment to community service
- · demonstrates financial need
- is a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident with a valid permanent resident card or passport stamped I-551

How To Apply

To apply for the scholarship, you must provide:

- a one-page statement outlining financial need
- the official transcript for your most recently completed academic term; this should include your Fall 2022 grades and cumulative GPA
- two recommendation letters (one should be from a school advisor or the chair of the dissertation committee)
- two original essays, answering the following essay questions (maximum of 500 words per question):
 - Describe how your approach to learning is aligned with the work of Bob Moses.
 - Tell us a bit about yourself, your background, why you should be awarded the Robert (Bob) Moses Scholarship
 and how this scholarship will help you support underserved communities.

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The Robert "Bob" Moses Scholarship is a national scholarship opportunity designed to support a graduate student from an underrepresented group who is pursuing a master's or doctoral degree in mathematics education or a STEM discipline. The scholarship award is \$15,000 and the application deadline is April 3, 2023.

Students who will complete all degree requirements in Spring or Summer are eligible to participate in the University Spring commencement ceremony. Students who complete degree requirements in Summer and who did not participate in the University Spring commencement ceremony have the option to participate in the University Fall commencement ceremony.

Please remember that there are separate academic calendars for the <u>15-week semester</u> and the <u>Alternative Block schedules</u>. Make sure to check the corresponding calendars if you have a mix of block & 15-week courses this semester.
