Three Minute Thesis (3MT®) is a Research Communication Competition that challenges Graduate Students to present a compelling oration on his or her research endeavors in just 3 minutes to a non-specialist audience.

The winner will represent ECU at the Conference of Southern Graduate Schools Meeting in Annapolis, Maryland.



3 Minute Thesis competition is a great way to begin to hone your presentation skills and master a short "elevator speech" about your research. Summarizing research in 3 minutes is tough, but sometimes, that's all you have when you are on the phone with a funding agency and they want to know what your research is about and why they should fund you!

Talk with your research mentor today about applying for and preparing for the 3MT competition. It a fun day with lots of students, faculty, and friends of ECU—you will learn a great deal about the fantastic things graduate students are doing on this campus! Dear ECU Graduate Students:

I hope the start of your fall semester is going well. We are happy to see the number of graduate students growing at East Carolina University and want to do all we can to provide you with the support systems and resources you need to be successful. On behalf of the 29 departments and the more than 300 Student Affairs educators in the division, I wanted to share some of the engagement opportunities we provide.

First, a common myth is that Student Affairs services are really only available for undergraduate students. A very high percentage of Student Affairs programs and services are open to all students and, in fact, we are becoming more intentional with creating programming specific to our 5,400+ graduate students.

Campus Recreation and Wellness hosted the first ever Grad Student Welcome at the North Recreation Complex (NRC) in mid-August. More than 50 grad students and their families enjoyed the beach house, kayaks, zip line and free snacks. The NRC is open for our grad students every day and all you need is your OneCard. In addition, Student Involvement and Leadership has started graduate student night at Mendenhall Student Center (MSC) where you can enjoy free bowling and billiards. This will occur each month and started Sept. 8th. These free grad student only events will also be October 13, November 10 and December 8.

Also in MSC, the Student Activities Board provides free movies to our students each Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. These are films that have recently left the movie theater but haven't been released on DVD or streaming. Campus Dining services is also working on adapting one of its dining plans to better fit the lifestyle and schedules of our graduate students.

In the coming months, the Division of Student Affairs will be submitting regular articles in this newsletter to open lines of communication between you and the division, and also to educate and empower you to get more engaged this coming year.

Electronic Thesis & Dissertation Submission Workshops

If you are completing a thesis or dissertation as a formal part of your graduate program, you are required to upload it to the <u>VIREO system</u>. This system allows you to communicate with the Graduate School about format and other structural issues after you successfully defend.

It is wise for you to attend these workshops or watch the online recordings so that you are aware of the process. You are not "done" with your degree until all requirements are completed—and that means the Graduate School has reviewed, approved, and notified the Registrar that your dissertation or thesis has been completed and accepted. This is done through the VIREO system.

Planning Ahead

Submitting a thesis or dissertation in Fall?

The <u>deadline</u> for uploading your thesis or dissertation to the VIREO system is <u>December 1, 2016 at 5:00 PM EST</u>. If you miss this deadline, your graduation date will likely be May, 2017. Talk to your director now about making sure you will meet this deadline. You can check out <u>VIREO on the Graduate School website</u> and start planning your upload. And don't' forget to close your IRB when you research is complete.

Foundation for Agromedicine and Toxicology Graduate Student Scholarships

To support research, education, and outreach in Agromedicine and the Toxicological Sciences, the Foundation announces the availability of supplemental scholarships designed to enrich the graduate student experience (e.g., books for relevant classes, travel to scientific meetings, publication costs for manuscripts) and requests nominations and applications. The Supplemental Scholarships are paid directly to the student and are not to be used as part of a graduate stipend.

The Supplemental Scholarships are open to graduate students in the stated fields from North Carolina State University, East Carolina University, North Carolina A&T University and the North Carolina Agromedicine Institute. Several awards of \$2000.00 each are generally granted. The deadline for receipt of applications is November 1st.
